

CCJR Scholarship Requirements

- Cowboy/Cowgirl demonstrates excellence and achievement both inside the arena as well as outside the arena.
 - Consecutive placings in events. (Girl – breakaway, goat tying, barrels, poles, team roping, ribbon roping. Boy – tie down, team roping, chute dogging, ribbon roping, rough stock.)
 - Demonstrates horsemanship
 - Demonstrates sportsmanship
 - Demonstrates leadership
 - Essay of “What the rodeo lifestyle means to you and how it has helped you develop into the person you are?” (1 Page)
 - Years of participation
- \$500.00 Scholarship (2 scholarships if funding allows)
- Candidate must have graduated in the 2021 school year and be attending a University, Community College, or Trade School. Scholarship recipient will receive check after showing proof of school registration.
- Recipients can defer scholarship for up to 30 months for military or church service.
